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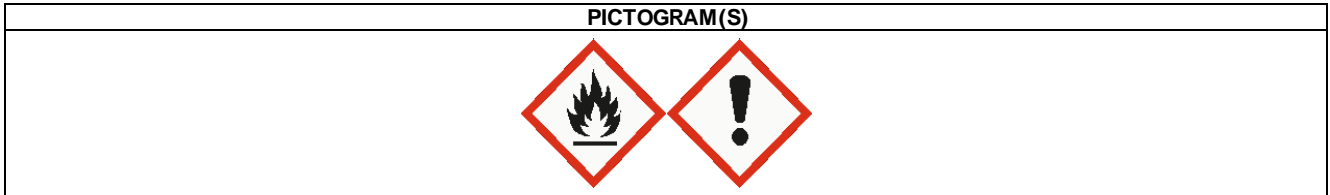

**Precautionary Statements**

#### 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

<b>Inhalation:</b>	Move to fresh air. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If symptoms develop and persist, get medical attention.
<b>Skin contact:</b>	Immediately wash skin thoroughly with soap and water. If symptoms develop and persist, get medical attention. Wash clothing before reuse.
<b>Eye contact:</b>	Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. Get medical attention immediately if skin or eyes become bonded.

#### 5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES
